

Southern Wisconsin Trout Unlimited Beginning Fly Tying Course Tools and Materials Needed for the Course

All materials needed for the beginning fly tying course are provided in class, but students must provide the tools and thread. The essential tools for fly tying are:

1. A fly tying vise
2. A pair of small scissors
3. A thread Bobbin
4. A fly-tying bodkin
5. A pair of hackle pliers
6. A hair stacker
7. A whip finisher tool (although finishing knots can be tied by hand)

The above tools can be purchased individually, but they are also widely available as relatively inexpensive kits suitable for beginning fly tyers. For example:

A few consumable supplies are also needed for the course. The items are:

1. Thread: 6/0 fly-tying thread in black, gray, and olive.
2. Dubbing wax (helpful but not absolutely essential)
3. Head cement (helpful but not absolutely essential)
